Voting Methods February LWVADC Meetings

After the November 2016 election with the Electoral College winner receiving fewer votes than the Popular Vote winner alternate methods of voting were tossed around as ways to “reform” the voting system for the United State.

Several methods are already in existence around the country including the Instant Runoff Voting (IRV) method. Come to the Unit meetings this month and learn what options are out there and where they are being used now and proposed for the future.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS: TIPS ON TAKING ACTION THIS LEGISLATIVE SESSION ***

The Colorado General Assembly Convenes on January 11th. While the legislature is in session, you will receive emails with a **Call to Action from the state League (LWVCO)** requesting you, as a private citizen, to take some specific action on an issue or position. When we respond to calls to action we are, in effect, lobbying. We are advocating our legislators to take a specific position on an issue.

Legislators have minimal staff support while the legislature is in session, and they have NO staff when not in session. This makes it challenging to respond personally to all contacts. Email is often the best way to communicate with your legislator.

Tips provided for effective email included:

- ☐ put the bill number in the subject line,
- ☐ make the email short and to the point
- ☐ if there is a personal story relevant to the issue include it and
- ☐ use bullets when possible.
